Fiscal Year 2019/2020 Grant Awards

**A CAC UPDATE FROM THE ENGINEERING
DIVISION**

Overview

- ▶ The City of Pittsburg received the following grant awards:
 - ▶ Local Road Safety Plan (LRSP) – Total \$72,000.
 - ▶ Pavement Management Technical Assistance Program (P-TAP) - \$40,880.
 - ▶ Program for Arterial System Synchronization (PASS) - \$16,748.

LRSP GRANT AWARD

- ▶ California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) award LRSP grant to The City of Pittsburg in the amount of \$72,000 on October 2019.
- ▶ Update collision data, perform community outreach, and develop a plan to improve safety for vehicles and pedestrians within City.

LRSP GRANT AWARD (Cont'd)

- ▶ Requirement: Local match of \$8,000.
- ▶ Sufficient funds are available for re-allocation in the Traffic Signal Modification Project (Project 2220).



P-TAP GRANT AWARD

- ▶ Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) award P-TAP grant to The City of Pittsburgh in the amount of \$40,880 on November 2019.
- ▶ Create an inventory street pavement database, assess pavement conditions, record historical maintenance, forecast budget needs, and view impacts of funding on citywide pavement conditions.

P-TAP GRANT AWARD (Cont'd)

- ▶ Requirement: Local match of \$10,220.
- ▶ Sufficient funds are available for re-allocation in the ST-99 Fiscal Year 19/20 Citywide Pavement Management (Project 2223).



PASS GRANT AWARD

- ▶ Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) award PASS grant to The City of Pittsburgh in the amount of \$16,748 on October 2019.
- ▶ Perform study and improve travel time along the East Leland Road travel corridor from Piedmont Way to Century Boulevard during peak commute hours.

PASS GRANT AWARD (Cont'd)

- ▶ Requirement: Local match of \$3,552.
- ▶ Sufficient funds are available for re-allocation in the Traffic Signal Modification Project (Project 2220).



UPDATE ON GRANT AWARDS

- ▶ City Council met on May 4, 2020 to consider the following:
 - ▶ Acceptance of LRSP Grant, PASS Grant, and P-TAP Grant funding.
 - ▶ Re-allocation of City funds to meet local match funding requirements.
