Police Department Technology Improvement Project





- The Police Department's demand on Remote Camera Monitoring Technology services has increased substantially over the past 10 years.
- The Police Department is committed to employing the latest innovations and technology to provide the community with effective and up-to-date law enforcement services.
- The technology currently in use is storage-intensive, spanning the retention of video footage across 175+ cameras strategically placed throughout the city.
- These systems require an extensive amount of data storage and system capacity
 and must be able to run efficiently to actively store and monitor the robust camera
 system implemented throughout the city. The department's current server and data
 warehouse are operating at maximum capacity and have started dropping
 significantly in operational efficiency.





 The Police Department camera server upgrade will more than triple the current amount of storage. These new servers run more efficiently and are structured in a way that will allow for future expansion in order to keep up with the growth and expansion of technology utilized by the city.

- The Information and Technology Team and the Pittsburg Police Department will be recommending to council approval to authorize a contract for the purchase of servers, data storage, and networks in an amount not to exceed \$296,966.00.
- The server and software upgrade proposed for this project will bring the Police Department into compliance with Department of Justice requirements and will meet the department's daily operational needs.





Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG)







The Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) program is the leading source of federal justice funding to state and local jurisdictions. The JAG Program provides states, tribes, and local governments with critical funding necessary to support a range of program areas including law enforcement, prosecution, indigent defense, courts, crime prevention and education, corrections and community corrections, drug treatment and enforcement, planning, evaluation, technology improvement, and crime victim and witness initiatives and mental health programs and related law enforcement and corrections programs, including behavioral programs and crisis intervention teams.



Enhancing Surveillance and Security with Vigilant Camera Expansion

The Pittsburg Police Department is committed to creating a safer and more secure community. We aim to enhance our state-of-the-art public safety camera system in the city of Pittsburg by deploying three (3) Vigilant ALPR cameras strategically throughout the city. These cameras will significantly enhance our ability to monitor and respond to security-related incidents, ensuring the safety of residents, businesses, and visitors. This technology advancement will serve as a valuable tool in the Pittsburg Police Department's overall Crime Reduction Strategy.

Objectives:

The primary objectives of this project are as follows:

- 1. Improve overall security and safety within the City of Pittsburg.
- 2. Reduce crime rates and case closure by enhancing our public safety camera system footprint.
- 3. Provide law enforcement agencies with valuable visual evidence to aid in criminal investigations.
- 4. Enhance community members' peace of mind and sense of security.
