


Implementation Measures

Organizations Conducting These Types of Events:

- Pittsburg Unified School District (PUSD)
- Churches
- Clubs
- Pittsburg Arts and Community Foundation (PACF)
- Los Medanos College (LMC)

Options:



Option 1 Up to \$500 Assistance

- Organization apply for funding
- \$10,000 allocation will fund up to 20 organization

Option 2 Facility Use Up to \$500 Value

- Organization apply for funding
- \$10,000 allocation will fund up to 30 organization

Option 3 City Controlled Advertising

- Organization apply for advertising
- Staff time cost

Criteria for Applying and Receiving Assistance

For \$500 or Facilities Assistance

- Organization must be a certified 501c(3) tax exempted entity
- Applications period April; award June; and disbursement July (next fiscal year)
- Organization must present its request to the Life Enrichment Subcommittee
- Assistance will not be more than 10% of the event or program's overall budget
- No City assistance within previous 24 months
- Assistance is available while funding lasts

Criteria to Applying and Receiving Advertising Assistance

Event must be Community based


Organization must provide publication ready artwork and narrative

 Advertising will run 30-days through the event or program, but no earlier than 2 weeks before the program

Recommendation



- Option 1 Provide financial assistance and allocate \$10,000 from the General Fund
- Option 2 Provide facility use assistance and allocate \$10,000 from the General Fund
- Option 3 Continue to provide advertising assistance
 - Continue the same practice

CDBG Process



2025 – 2030 Consolidated Plan (Con Plan)

- Identify Local Needs
- Address Local Needs
- Activities must meet National Objectives

National Objectives

- Benefit low to moderate income people
- Aid in prevention or elimination of slums or blight
- Urgent need (i.e. damage due to natural disasters)

- Community meetings will be conducted by the Consortium and each City member
- Consortium's Two Subcommittees
 - Multiple Housing Needs Group Meetings
 - Multiple Non-Housing Needs Group Meetings
- Surveys currently being finalized
