Overview

Department Training Overview:

- (6) dedicated training days a year (in house)
- Periodic briefing trainings and training bulletins
- -Primary focus on California Peace Officer Standards and Trainings (POST) required training
- -Constantly sending Officers to outside training which focuses on a variety of topics, instructor roles, trends, and development.

PSP's



CA POST PSP (Perishable Skills Program)

-18 required hours every (2) years in various areas including firearms, use of force, driving, arrest tactics, and communications.

The five (5) categories of courses included in the PSP are:

Category I	Tactical Firearms	4 hour minimum
Category II	Driver Training/Awareness	4 hour minimum
Category III	Arrest & Control	4 hour minimum
Category IV	Strategic Communications	2 hour minimum
Category V	Use of Force	4 hour minimum





Our Two Year Training Cycles:

- -We train 120 hours every 2 years.
- -Topics include all those discussed in the PSP's plus: Less lethal force options, scenario based training, search and seizure, deescalation, first aid/CPR and more.
- -We use many training sites such as the police department, MOTCO base, our range facility, and more.
- -Our instructors are motivated and trained via in house training and advanced Officer schooling.

23-24 Cycle



Current 2023-2024 Training Cycle

- -We are a little over halfway through our current (2) year cycle.
- -All PSP's have been completed, with driving planned next month.
- -In 2023, we focused on de-escalation and use of force training.
- -In 2023, we conducted a multi month active incident training plan including classroom training, medical training, and scenarios.
- -In December/January, the Museum of Tolerance provided all PPD Officers with their "Beyond Diversity Program," and racial profiling update, which is a every 5 year POST requirement.




