EXHIBIT B DISCLOSURE CATEGORIES

As part of the Conflict of Interest Code of the City of Pittsburg, the designated positions described in Exhibit A are assigned to one or more of the following disclosure categories. Each holder of a designated position shall file an annual statement (Form 700) disclosing that individual's interest in investments, business positions, real property, and income, designated as reportable under that category to which the office or position is assigned as follows:

An investment, business position, interest in real property, or income is reportable if the business entity in which the investment or business position is held, the interest in real property, or the income or source of income may foreseeably be affected materially by any decision made or participated in by the holder of the designated position, or by virtue of the designated position held by that individual.

Designated Employees in Category "I" must report:

All investments, business positions in, and income from sources located in or doing business in the City and all interests in real property located in the City, including property located within a two-mile radius of the City or any property owned or used by the City of Pittsburg.

Designated Employees in Category "II" must report:

All investments, business positions in, and sources of income of the type which provide services, supplies, materials, machinery or equipment of the type utilized by the City of Pittsburg.

Designated Employees in Category "III" must report:

All investments, business positions in, and sources of income which are subject to the regulatory, permit or licensing authority of the City of Pittsburg.

Disclosure by Consultants

Consultants shall be included in the list of designated employees and shall disclose pursuant to the broadest disclosure category (Category I) in the Conflict of Interest Code subject to the following limitation:

The City Manager may determine in writing that a particular consultant, although a "designated position," is hired to perform a range of duties that is limited in scope and thus is not required to fully comply with the disclosure requirements in this section. The written determination shall include the basis for this determination and shall be maintained as a public record to the same extent as other disclosures made under the Conflict of Interest Code.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Pursuant to the Political Reform Act (Act), local governments are required to conduct a biennial review of its Conflict of Interest Code (Code) to determine accuracy. As part of this year's biennial review, City staff has determined that the Code must be amended to reflect new, reclassified, and eliminated employee positions. Updating the Code will identify all of the designated positions that are required, by state law, to disclose financial interests.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no fiscal impact.

RECOMMENDATION

Adopt the amended Code.

BACKGROUND

Section 18730 of Title 2 of the California Code of Regulations contains the terms of a standard Conflict of Interest Code which may be adopted and incorporated by reference as the City's Code.

Government Code Section 87200 et seq. requires members of the City Council, Planning Commissioners, City Manager, City Attorney, City Treasurer and other public officials who manage public investments to disclose certain financial interests annually. The City's Code identifies all other employee positions that participate in the making of governmental decisions. These designated positions are required to disclose certain financial interests under state law.

A public official or employee has a conflict of interest under the Act when all of the following occur:

- The official makes, participates in making, or uses their official position to influence a governmental decision;
- It is reasonably foreseeable that the decision will affect the official's economic interest;
- The effect of the decision on the official's economic interest will be material; and
- The effect of the decision on the official's economic interest will be different than its effect on the public generally.

SUBCOMMITTEE FINDINGS

This item was not presented to a subcommittee.

STAFF ANALYSIS

Upon review, City staff determined that the Code must be amended in order to accurately reflect the addition, reclassification, and elimination of certain employee positions. Organizational structure requires amending the Code to accurately identify and designate employee positions that are subject to state financial disclosure requirements.

The City's conflict of interest code must designate all officials and employees of, and consultants to, the agency who make or participate in making governmental decisions that could cause conflicts of interest. These individuals are required by the code to file statements of economic interests and to disqualify themselves when conflicts of interest occur. The disclosure required under a conflict of interest code for a particular designated official or employee should include only the kinds of personal economic interests they could significantly affect through the exercise of their official duties.

The attached Resolution adopts the Fair Political Practices Commission's standard Conflict of Interest Code and amends the City's Code with an updated list of designated positions and identifies the disclosure categories to reflect the City's current organizational structure.
