

- City adopted a NEW water ordinance effective January 2012



New Ordinance Requirements


- \$250 deposit from tenants. Waive the deposit requirement if:
 - (1) the tenant has promptly paid their
 Pittsburg water bills during the previous 12 months
 - (2) The water account is in the landlord's name
- Proof of property ownership and tenancy required to open a new Water account










PART I CRIMES (VIOLENT & PROPERTY)



2011 VIOLENT CRIME COMPARISON


